The Division of Services for People with Disabilities (DSPD) promotes opportunities and provides supports for people with disabilities to lead self-determined lives by overseeing home and community-based services for more than 5,000 people who have disabilities. Support includes community living, day services, and supported employment services.

There is a significant waiting list due to funding limitations. The wait list is prioritized based upon severity of need and some limited services are available to waitlisted individuals on an as needed basis.

DSPD provides services using a series of Home and Community Based Medicaid waivers, and qualifications vary dependent on the waiver. For more information on Specific Services please contact DSPD.
